Western Australia		WA State border closure The WA Government has announced the temporary closure of the Western Australian border. Western Australia - INTRASTATE		To assist in reducing the spread of COVID-19, the WA Government has introduced further restrictions on travel within Western Australia. After 11:59pm Tuesday, 31 March 2020. Access to designated areas, including the Kimberley, the entire Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku, and parts of the Shire of East Pilbara (including the communities of Jigalong, Martu homeland communities and Kiwirrkurra) have additional stronger restrictions in place. This is to help curb the spread of COVID-19 into our very vulnerable communities, which could have catastrophic consequences. Queensland		Those living outside of Queensland who provide critical services to Queensland, may be exempt to self-quarantine. If you are providing these critical services and need to enter Queensland, you can apply for an entry pass. South Australia		The direction provides exemptions to those classified as an 'essential traveller'. Travellers entering the state will be required to determine if they meet these requirements. Northern Territory		Interstate arrivals - Arrivals in the NT from interstate from 11:59pm 1 April will be escorted to hotels and monitored for 14 days of quarantine. If you arrive after 3 April, you will need to pay for quarantine costs. Exemptions apply for individuals engaged in specific work with specific skills. Tasmania		If you meet the criteria for Essential Travellers status you may be exempted from the 14 day quarantine requirement but you must still comply with the conditions described in Quarantine conditions for Essential Travellers.
